Summary of RBPC 40th Anniversary Membership Meeting October 28, 2011

THE ANNUAL MEETING of the Rare Breeds Pigeon Club was called to order by Vice President Jim Fathbruckner following an excellent 40th anniversary dinner consisting of Louisville's finest barbeque and butter milk pie.

Jim explained he was running the meeting due to the RBPC president, Ron Davis', inability to attend the meeting because of illness. Those attending signed a card to Ron wishing him well.

Jim began the meeting by recognizing members that had passed away during this past year including Bob Heal, Richard Dobson and Chet Davis.

He then gave a brief review of the status of the Club including:

- the Rare Breeds' show was the largest single meet at the National Young Bird Show;
- Jerry Sindelar from Canada was a welcome new judging addition to the NYBS;
- that the number of rare breeds meets was up across the country;
- the work RBPC members had done working with the NPA to expand the *Book of Standards* to include many rare breeds; and
- that the auctions at last year's NYBS and at the Reading Club show in Lancaster showed other fanciers were very interested in rare breeds.

Jim recognized the hard work that Scott Amo and Frank Povah had given into producing the Club's *Bulletin*.

Members who had attained Master Breeder status were recognized: Dan Brennan, who could not be present, and Bob Jakubowski. Jim presented Bob with his Master Breeder patch.

A Treasurer's report was presented by Link Martin which showed the Club started 20011 with a balance of \$2,069.44, had income of \$3,175.50 and expenses of \$3,718.94. The balance as of September 30, 2011 was \$1,526.00.

There were several items of discussion and action:

Standards Committee

Jim called for volunteers to serve on a Standards Committee. The committee would review proposed and translated standards for new breeds or newly imported breeds. The Committee would then recommend to the Executive Committee whether the standard should be adopted and submitted to the NPA.

Website

it was agreed that the RBPC website needed updating and had to be a more active site. A good website is essential to the growth of the Club. It was agreed the officers would pursue immediate updates and then a long term solution.

Online discussion group

Jim shared that he had been approached from fanciers active on the Rare Varieties online Yahoo discussion group to have the group relate to the RBPC. It could be as simple as having a RBPC officer serve as one of the moderators of the group. It was agreed that Jim should pursue the discussion.

Clarification of what constitutes a rare breed

Over the past few years a few specialty clubs have asked that their breeds no longer be included in the rare breed while others has asked to have their specific breed to be judged as a rare when there is not a specialty club meet. It was agreed that there needed to some

clarification with clubs and a process if a specialty club dissolved and their breed would need to come back into the rare category. Jim agreed to talk with the other clubs and clarify the situation with each breed.

Dues

It was agreed to have the Vice President contact members who were behind in their dues and advise them that they would no longer receive the bulletin.

Annual Meetings/Dinner

It was agreed to hold an annual meeting/dinner at the NYBS

The election of officers

Elections should have taken place in 2011. It was agreed to create a nominating committee, publish a call for nominations in the upcoming bulletin and hold elections in spring 2012 with those elected taking office at the 2012 NYBS.

Jim adjourned the meeting and wished everyone luck with the NYBS show that would start the next morning.

WHAT'S SO IMPORTANT ABOUT

FEBRUARY 15, 2012?

As an NPA affiliated club many of you have been following, with interest, the establishment of the Legacy Fund Trust and the many benefits it will be capable of providing to all pigeon fanciers, just like yourself, but as with most things it takes a few ounces of help from each of us to set the ball a rolling.

You'll each soon have this opportunity to help the pigeon hobby as the NPA Legacy Fund Trust initiates a Capital Campaign to fund the Trust beginning February 15, 2012.

Several fanciers that were aware of the Trust from the beginning have shown early support and have already made donations. The Trust has started to grow!

Please let me review and share the Legacy Fund Trust Vision with you.

Several years in the making, the Trust was carefully and legally crafted. Established in June of this year the Trust allows for a Safe, Permanent, Legal structure, with financially sound, checks and balances built right in. The Trust is for all of those who wish to financially give something back to the pigeon hobby, a hobby we so much have enjoyed. All pigeon fanciers, former fanciers and friends to the pigeon hobby are invited and encouraged to participate, at a time that is right for them.

Monies donated or bequests left to the Legacy Fund Trust will never be used nor spent. The Trust's principle will forever continue to grow from these ongoing donations and **only** the **investment income** produced from this ever growing pool of Trust assets will be used to fund well defined and accountable projects that will benefit each of us in the pigeon hobby.

All Legacy Fund Trust assets and accounts are and Legally Must Be, completely separate from those of the NPA.

Your giving to the Trust will allow for you to receive a thank you letter and a Certificate of Contribution, indicating one of four giving levels or clubs. These very attractive certificates are printed on parchment and are suitable for framing.

Your giving is cumulative and would include you in one of the following giving categories: Gold Band Club, giving between \$100 and \$999.99; Platinum Band Club, giving between \$1000 and \$9999.99; President's Club, giving between \$10,000 and \$49,999.99 and the Vision Club, giving of \$50,000 or more.

Some fanciers will be able to give time and assistance; numerous others will give modest financial amounts, many of these may also, with future giving, allow for their donations to be cumulative over time thus moving these donors from one giving category to the next higher level. Other fanciers or former fanciers after reflecting on a lifetime in the hobby and those financially capable of doing so will give a great deal. For some fanciers this giving may come many years down the road in the form of a bequest in their will and the Legacy Fund Trust is legally established to accept and accommodate these gifts.

Neither the Trust nor the NPA is a 501c3 and therefore your donation is not tax deductible but rather shows your strong commitment of support for the pigeon hobby now and into the future.

Each and every year, that's forever, you as a donor will receive special recognition with your name being listed on the **Legacy Fund Trust Honor Roll**, published in a National Pigeon Association Publication. NPA members as well as non members are invited and encouraged to participate in this campaign, for the benefit of our hobby now and well into the future.

Many of you who have dreamed, have had a great idea or a Vision for ways we could improve and make our hobby even better for each of us, if only there was the funding nationally, to help accomplish those great ideas.

The Legacy Fund Trust is currently the right vehicle to help accomplish many of those excellent ideas and goals. This can be your chance to participate and really help out. Please consider being part of the effort!

Not many of us can take on the financial burden of funding a project by ourselves much less the multitude of other good ideas that are out there, but each of us by giving something to the Trust and then taken as a cohesive focused group, will allow for great things to be accomplish together. Please don't negate the power of the possible!

Just consider some of the many projects that might someday be funded with Legacy Fund Trust investment income. Funds might be used to help continue and even expand the current 4H

youth program or some other venue, possibly on Facebook or other social networking sites that can spark the interests and involves today's youth in our hobby. Youth as well as new and former adult pigeon fanciers can and do become interested in our hobby, but in order to first capture their attention in a busy world, it takes funding to get the message out in pet magazines, country living magazines, bird, poultry, rabbit and nature magazines. Advertising plus the important and necessary follow-up contacts and associated mailings costs can be expensive but is surely well worth the expenditure if the result can be a growing number of pigeon fanciers.

A professionally done and clinically correct report, in pamphlet form, using information from health and veterinary organizations on the safety of raising domestic pigeons could be created and then used for wide distribution.

Funding could help establish a comprehensive and electronically accessible archive of NPA history and memorabilia, possibly located at the American Pigeon Museum and Library.

Trust funding might help develop a team of experts who could, in many ways, help local fanciers maintain their right to raise and enjoy pigeons where city ordinances threaten their ability to do so. Funding could help hire a lobbyist who has the ability to penetrate the upper echelons of the US Postal Service to help maintain and improve the shipping of pigeons. What a great help this can be to most every fancier.

The list could go on and on and I'm sure each one of you have a few favorite good ideas yourself that you can pass on.

The Legacy Fund Trustees have chosen and John Heppner has graciously accepted the task of being the Chief Development Officer for the upcoming campaign.

John is an individual who has had a great deal of previous capitol campaign and fundraising experience as a former school administrator.

As we approach February 15 and beyond, John Heppner will be asking for **your help** and that of many others within the pigeon hobby. If at all possible, **please say yes** to his request for your **help**, **funding** or **both**.

Grand National Rules

Read these Rules carefully and make sure you thoroughly understand them. Do not enter if you cannot abide by these Rules.

- 1. Failure to recognize or abide by these rules will exclude entry without refund.
- 2. The entry fee is \$6.50 per bird for non-NPA members and \$5.50 per bird for NPA members.
- 3. This show only recognizes NPA approved bands. All birds must be seamless banded and within one size for that breed.
- This show recognizes all breeds of NPA recognized standard-bred pigeons and ADA recognized doves.
- Specialty clubs have selected their own judges and their decisions are final.
 Open class judges have been selected by the host club and their decisions are final.
- 6. Each pigeon entered must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor and must be shown in its natural condition. Proper trimming and preparation is considered natural condition. The right is reserved to disqualify all unworthy specimens.
- 7. The show management will not be responsible for the loss of birds. However, the best security possible will be given.
- 8. An NPA Show Catalog listing exhibitor's names, placings (one past half the class) and awards will be printed and mailed to all exhibitors that are not NPA members for a fee of \$20. NPA members will receive one at no charge.
- 9. Clean water and feed shall be provided daily.
- 10. An adequate amount of bedding shall be provided and shall be available for replenishment during the show.
- 11. All birds entered in the show will be cooped individually.
- 12. No substitutions will be made prior to check-in at the show. Substitutions shown with specialty clubs will be allowed as the individual specialty club allows. The exhibitor must make the

- change on the coop card and give the change to the specialty club secretary prior to judging so the change can be made on the judging sheet. Open class substitutions will be permitted only when made in the same class, color, age and sex as the original entry.
- 13. When a display award is given, the specialty club shall establish the method of scoring points.
- 14. The show management reserves the right to reject healthy or diseased specimens received for exhibition. If sickness develops, the ill bird will be removed from the show hall.
- 15. The Grand National officially opens on Thursday morning at 10:00 am. Birds may

All birds must be cooped by no later than 4:00 pm on Thursday. All entered birds must remain in the show hall until 5:00 pm Saturday. Birds may be crated at 4:00 pm on Saturday and will be released at 5:00 pm Saturday after ALL exhibitors have verified that all their birds are in their possession.

- 16. The number of placings in each class shall be determined by the Specialty Club.
- 17. A Grand National Championship Certificate will be awarded to each breed exhibited where two or more exhibitors are showing.
- Specialty Clubs shall establish their own classes. Where no club agreement is in effect, classes shall be provided for Young hen, Young Cock, Old Hen, Old Cock.
- 19. No birds shall be allowed in the show hall area on which an entry fee has not been paid. Entered birds may be sold but must remain in the show hall until all birds are released on Saturday.
- 20. Pigeon carriers may be stored under the exhibition cages, provided that they have no birds in them and must remain there until release time (when all birds have been accounted for). Carriers must fit under the tables without protruding into the aisles. If they are too large, a storage area will be provided.
- 21. A violation of these rules will result in a partial or total loss of rebate to the Specialty Club involved and under contract for this show. A consideration of the loss of exhibiting privileges may also be considered by the NPA Board. The Board's decision in these matters is final.

The NPA Grand National Show is "Open Competition". Birds will be shown with sponsoring specialty breed club.
