Annual Business Meeting, 2014

MEETING HELD at the Days Inn Hotel in Jeffersonville Indiana at 1800 Friday October 24. Meeting called to order by President James Fathbruckner with fourteen (14) members present were:

Dinner was obtained from KFC.

First order of business was the Annual Financial Report.

Current balance of \$2775.46 in checking. Major source of income from Auctions held at NYBS, Des Moines and Lancaster shows. Membership dues provide income at \$15.00 annually. Average cost to put out the Bulletin approaches \$300.00 and it goes out quarterly. Other expenses are Premium book ads for NYBS \$75.00, Des Moines \$75.00 and the GN at \$100.00. Awards; Rosettes and ribbons \$811.49 and memorial mugs \$130.00. USPS shipping \$52.52 and annual website fee to James Laverne \$90.00.

Members voted to not donate money to the Legacy fund this year due to the NPA secretary not confirming last year's donation. Membership did vote for \$100.00 for the Pigeon Museum.

Master Breeder points were discussed by membership.

Currently 500 points needed for Specialty Master Breeder and 1000 for All Breed Master Breeder. Only the National shows earn 100 master breeder points for Grand Champion. Motion made and membership agreed that Des Moines and Lancaster shows be added to the list of shows where 100 points are awarded to the Grand Champion and Reserve gets 50 points starting in 2015.

Members Handbook states 20 birds needed for a sanction meet.

Motion made and membership agreed to raise the number to 30 birds needed for a sanctioned meet.

A concern was raised that a person judging a show could also have birds in the meet and have another Judge judge his birds.

Motion made that the Judge may not have birds in the show and judge any part of the show. Membership agreed.

Preamble to following matter: In 2008 Ron Davis (lacking any Rare Breeds records) allowed members to self report how many Master Breeder points they had. Some members expressed concern that at least one member lacked integrity in self reporting.

A discussion of integrity and ethics ensued.

A motion was made and membership agreed to the creation of an Ethics Board. The Board will have three people drawn from a list of eligible candidates. Candidates will be asked to discuss an ethical matter when a complaint of ethics is presented to the club. No candidate for the Ethics Board can be involved in the complaint. The discussion of the Board is done in secret and they shall discuss the validity of the complaint. If warranted the Board will determine an appropriate course of discipline based on a scale of:

- 1. Minor offense
- 2. Moderate offense
- 3. Egregious offense.

Meeting adjourned at 2030.

IN THE MOST RECENT NPA Quarterly Mike Spencer wrote an article about his inclusion into the NPA Constitution of an Ethics Clause.

Over the past few years I have searched both the RBPC Constitution and the NPA constitution for information regarding rules governing behaviors of exhibitors. My NPA Constitution is old and I am pleased that Mike Spencer has taken the time to include ethics into it. This comes at just the same time that the RBPC has voted to create an ethics board. We are looking into the creation of RBPC show rules and expected appropriate behaviors of both exhibitors and members.

I have included in this bulletin the start of some show rules. Please help out the club and review the rules and add a few of your own. At the last Annual Meeting the members voted and agreed to create an ethics board to address any concerns brought to the RBPC Board.

On rare occasions we have witnessed loud and disruptive behaviors in the show hall and at Grand National settings. We now have the means to address these behaviors and other behaviors unfitting the RBPC and NPA.

If you have a concern you may now approach the Board and have your complaint reviewed by a panel of three members who are objective and not involved in the complaint. The panel must be members in good standing, exhibit a history of fairness and be unrelated to the complaint. The complaint will be reviewed and a solution will be suggested to the board.

The board will review the complaint and solution and take appropriate action. This process is new and we hope unnecessary. However, as a process in place we hope that it serves its purpose to derail future problems.

We are a rare group that celebrates an interest in promoting the pigeon hobby.

Each show should be a pleasant and fun day spent in the pursuit of fellowship. Show rules and expectations about personal behaviors will ensure a fun and fair day to be enjoyed by all.

As co-editor of the Bulletin I also encourage membership to write to me any complaints or concerns. We will publish these concerns so that the entire membership can participate in resolving and creating a healthy show environment. Together in pursuit of fellowship at make things better.

RARE BREED PIGEON SHOW - PROPOSED RULES —

- 1. Seamless pigeon bands only.
- 2. RBPC is not responsible for lost or stolen birds or personal property.
- 3. One bird per hole.
- 4. No sick, maimed or out of condition birds
- 5. All birds must be free of infectious disease and external parasites.
- 6. Bird(s) as described in 4 and 5 can be removed by the Judge in charge of a sanctioned meet.
- 7. Judge in Charge's decisions will be final.
- 8. Exhibitors failing to comply with show rules may be disqualified and/or forfeit wins.
- 9. Any person interfering (approaching or talking) with the judge or judging will be disqualified.
- 10. Protests and other concerns may be submitted to the RBPC Board for consideration.
- 11. No birds can be removed from the show until Championships are declared.



RECENTLY, DORATHEA [Purebred Pigeon—ed.] wrote an editorial about the merits of combining pigeon shows and chicken shows.

In November 2014 the Ohio National Chicken Show was held at the Ohio State Fair Grounds in Columbus. Along with nearly 10,000 poultry entries of all kinds there was a pigeon show with over 200 birds. It was the 100th annual show for this club and the second year they held a pigeon show. There was lots of media coverage, lots of visitors and, most importantly, there were hundreds of junior exhibitors. At my local pigeon shows we only get one or two juniors.

The NPA was also present at the show with a table set up to gather new members and answer pigeon related questions. Jerry Gagne, James Fath-bruckner and Jack Melkerson manned the booth. What I think the NPA and other pigeon clubs can take away from this show is how they draw and maintain a large number of juniors. Junior Showmanship classes were divided by age, they held an essay contest also divided by age and gave a scholar-ship award. The picture of the junior awards table on this page underlines their commitment to attracting junior members.

Over the past many years, in which I have attended many Grand Nationals I keep hearing about how junior membership is the future of our hobby. There is no question that this statement is true and the people of the Ohio National Chicken Show

have provided us with a blueprint for success. I now attend four chicken/pigeon shows in Ohio, each with thriving junior membership.

Juniors members are our future and they can be found at the chicken shows.





